## MAY ABOLISH PRISON

Paris, Dec. 30,--(AP)-The g ernment submitted to the Chamber of Deputies today a bill calling for basic changes in the French penal system as a first step toward aboli-tion of the Chamber penal tion of the Guianan prison colon known as "Devils Island."

Ministers explained the project as intended to permit development of French Guiana as well as to end criticism of France abroad because of the prisons on both mainland and constant intende and coastal islands.

Under the terms of the bill, th 3,000 prisoners now at the Guiana prisons would not be freed whole sale, but the colony would be per mitted to "extinguish" itself as the present prisoners are pardoned, serve out their terms or die.






