





(EDITOR'S NOTE: In the background of the automobile workers' strike is John L. Lewis's Committee for Industrial Organization, which last year split the American Federation of Labor. The following article by a reporter who has specialised in labor coverage explains some of Lawis's recent moves and his goals.)

Millions want the answer, but the hefty, bushy-browed labor leader and hie few trusted friends are keeping it to themselves.

Since Lewis out the strings that bound him to the American Federation of Labor's policy of organizing workers by craft, he has started campaigns in several industries to bring their employees into one big union for each industry.

Persistence in that plan caused the A. F. of L. to suspend the unions which he had banded together into the Committee for Industrial Organization.

Although he then began organization drives in the steel, auto, glass and other industries, the automobile campaign was the first to come to a head with the current General Motors strike.

Both labor observers and industrialists have expressed a variety of opinions as to when Lewis' combined enterprises would reach a grand climax.

Some say he will try to renew his own miners' contracts with the sept coal industry before he allows the steel drive to come to a head. The present contracts expire April 1.

Others say Lewis, hoping for President Roosevelt's support, might tackle both at once. Lewis keeps mum.
