DEMOCRATS' PLAN SPURNED BY HOUSE

State Capitol, Hartford, Jan. 11. -(AP)-The House approved a set of joint rules today which would leeve Republicans in control of com-mittees after it had turned down a Democratic compromise proposal The resolution containing the joint rules, facing certain defeat in the Senate, was adopted 162 to 71.

Previously, the House had voted 159 to 95 against the Democratic plan which in effect would have given Democrats virtual control of six important committees and leave Republicans in control of the others.

The House recessed immediately after voting on the joint resolution. The Democratic proposal, outlined by Rep. John D. Thoms, foor leader, provided that each committee comprise five Senators and 15 Representatives. The appropriations, finance, judiciary, cities and boroughs, labor and reorganizations committee would be made up of four Senate and six House Democrats and, one Senate and nine House Republicana. On these committees, the Senate chairman would have the power to cast the deciding rote in case of a se.

All other committees, the Representation would be ten House and two Senate Republicans, and three senate and five House Democrats. Thoms offered the plan as an amendment to a resolution providing for the adoption of joint rules of the General Assembly, and demanded a roil call on the proposal.

Speaking for his amendment, Thoms said: "I believe these six committees should be under Democratic control because they are the policy forming committees."
