SELECTIONS TO GET DATA ON GOLF LOTS PROJECT

Ask Recreation Committee Chairman for His Findings As to Cost-Legionnaires Ask Board to Consider Municipal Golf Course on the Site.

Chairman Horace V. Murphy of the Recreation committee, previously selected by the committee to ascertain the cost of purchasing the Old Golf lots of East Center street for recreational purposes, was instructed by the selectmen to report his findings to the selectmen next Monday night.

The Recreation committee has unveiled a recreational and civic center at the location including a large municipal auditorium, outdoor swimming pool, running track and other facilities.

332 MANCHESTER YOUTHS HAVE SERVED IN THE CCC

Average Enrollment Is For 11 Weeks; Payments Since Beginning Total \$91,603.
