(AP)—The General Assembly broke up the routine of receiving bills today to pass an administration bi ransferring the duties of the State Emergency Relief Commission to the State Welfare Department. Both Houses suspended the rules to take up the measure, the first of the administration proposals to come up for action this session.

The bill, favorably reported by the public welfare committees of both Houses, sounded the death the light of the ERC, an agency set up in the midst of the depression. The life of the commission was limited. e of the commission was limited February 1, 1937 by the 1933 to February 1, 1937 by the 1935
