## Lincoln Bests Taney In Three Rounds

**HE STARTED IT**  
Chief Justice Roger B. Taney brought the slavery issue to a head when, in his Dred Scott decision, he held a slave re-named Dred Scott free when taken into free territory.

**HE CARRIED THE FIGHT TO THE COURT**  
Lincoln, in his historic debate with Stephen A. Douglas as a candidate for the senate, expressed his reverence for the Supreme Court, but challenged Taney's legal logic. "We think," he said bluntly, "the Dred Scott decision is erroneous. Taney held the ground, and for months after the Civil War started locked horns with Lincoln again.

**AND HE WON**  
Public opinion in a majority of the states eventually supported Lincoln. The third and last encounter between the two men was the Lincoln-Douglas debate in 1858. Taney was defeated in the Lincoln-Douglas debate.

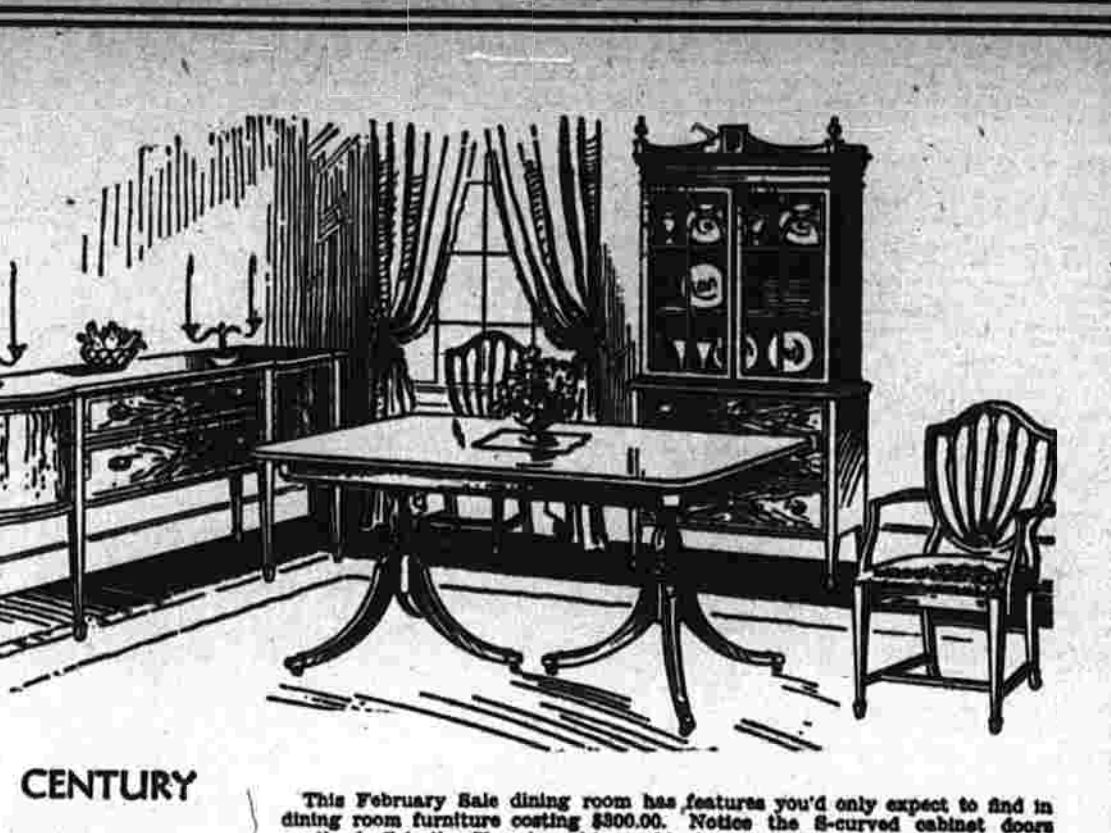

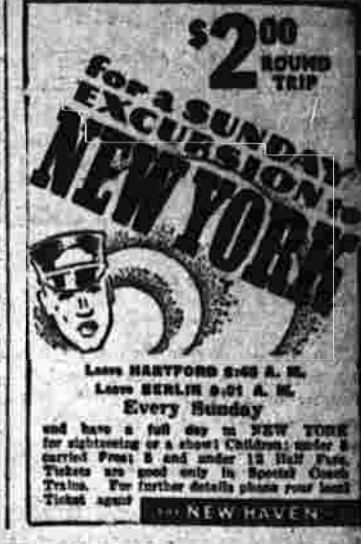
