



Supreme Court Side Glances



THIEF JUSTICE CHARLES EVANS HUGHES of the United States Supreme Court, sketched here in vivid style by NEA Service Artist George Clark, looks exactly like every man's mental picture of a learned judge.

Hughes, appointed chief justice by President Hoover in 1930, had already served on the court from 1910 to 1916, when he resigned to make his nearly successful run for the presidency against Woodrow Wilson.

Brilliant as a young lawyer, Hughes' talents later won him a lucrative corporation practice. Since his appointment as chief justice, Hughes has greatly speeded up the work of the court, keeping its docket more nearly up to date than formerly. Hughes was long regarded as the embodiment of austere conservatism, but has occupied the middle position in today's court, and has apparently tried to constitute himself a balance-wheel between its liberal and conservative factions. Known to have been distressed by the many close decisions of the court in recent years, Hughes is legitimately ambitious to go down in history as a great chief justice, handing on the court as an institution with its legal and public prestige unimpaired. public prestige unimpaired.


