At the top of the list detailed by \$1 Samuel Hoare, first lord of the admiralty, were placed three additional battleships, of the type of the King George V and the Prince of Wales, now building, with a displacement of 35,000 tons and carrying 14-inch guns.

Sir Samuel told the House of Commons the stepped up naval and naval air programs would add 11,000 officers and men to bring the total naval personnel to 112,000.

Two aircraft carriers, five cruisers of the "standard" 8,000 tons, 16 destroyers, seven patrol type submarines and 45 smaller vessels of all type, the admiralty lord announced, would swell Britain's mighty armads.

Washington, March 3- (AP) -Administration efforts to obtain neutrality law stronger than now evolution of American policy on freedom of the seas since the World War

War.

Virtually all phases of official thought on the subject have undergone sharp revision since American lives were lost and American shipping was destroyed in the struggle between the Allies and the Central Powers for command of the seas.

Nowhere, however, is the change so apparent as in the contrast between the pending neutrality proposal of Senator Pittman (D., Nev.) chairman of the Senate foreign relations committee, and the policy set forth by President Wilson and his advisers in 1914 concerning the rights of neutral shipping.

Then, official records show, American munitions dealers as well as exporters of other commodities were told by the government that nothing, save the risk of seizure on the high seas, prevented them from trading with the nations at war as well as with other neutral countries.

Opinion Has Changed

Today, this policy has been altered considerably. The present American endeavor is to preserve the freedom of the seas to trade with neutrals in time of war but to cut off the export of war implements and to belligerents.

The Pittman proposal would go farther by granting to the President discretionary authority to prohibit the shipment to belligerents in American vessels of raw materials and other commodities not actually in the category of munitions but necessary to the conduct of war.

Chicago, March 3—(AP) — This a farm week. An historical pageant "city of the big shoulders" preened itself today for its 100th birthday party.


