lokyo, March 8.-(AP) - Japa limavowed any intention of terripledged herself to a new policy built on a keystone of "equality" in dealing with her great continental neighbor. Foreign Minister Naotak Sato launched Japan on the "new deal" for China to the cheers of a Parliament stirred by his announcement. Japan, he declared in a maiden speech on his policy, must abandon her superiority complex in order ever to readjust her long-strained relations with China.

On that principle of "a fresh start on the basis of equality," he asserted, he would build the policy of Japan's foreign office which he has just taken over.

Newspapers throughout the Empire displayed Sato's speech under scare headlines as heralding a turning point in Sino-Japanese relations. Sato launched Japan on the "ner

"Japan has no territorial ambitions in China," Sato stressed, labelling as "imaginary" any fear that Japan intended to "go beyond the Great Wall and extend its influence to Central or South China."

"Japan respects Chinese interests and wishes to shake hands with them economically," he declared. "That is the only way Japan can expand there." Japan, he said, might as well recognize China's demands for equality with Japan.

"We must do something definite," he told the House of Representatives, "to improve our present unfavorable relations with China which are highly disadvantageous to both

JUSTICE BENJAMIN NATHAN CARDOZO IS A scholarly, retiring man who rose to the U. S. Supreme Court from distinguished service as a New York state judge, and without long or general practice as a lawyer. He served many years on the New York Supreme Court and Court of Appeals. Cardozo, descendant of one of the oldest Jewish families in America, has for many years been known in the profession as a "lawyer's lawyer."

Unmarried, Cardoso leads a sedentary, secluded life with his books, reading Green and Latin for recreation. His health is frail, and he is compelled to live carefully. His attitude toward New Deal legislation has been generally favorable, though he woted, as did all the others, against NRA and the Frazier-Lemke farm moratorium laws. Cardono's written decisions are models of clarity and precision, and his dissents have embodied some of the sharpest shafts loosed against the court majority. He is 67 years old, and was named to his present position by President Hoover.


