The bill requires the counsel, agent, or lobbyists to file with the secretary the names of their employers and a brief description of

The measure provides further that 'mo person, firm, corporation or association shall retail or employ any persons to promote or oppose legislation for compensation contingent in whole or in part upon the defeat or passage of any legislative measure."

Each agency or person employing a lobbyist is required to file with the secretary, within two months after adjournment of the Legislature, an itemized statement showing all expenses incurred.

Violations of the act carry maximum penalties of \$1,000 fine and in addition any employer failing to file a statement within the required time is subject to additional forfeit of \$100 a day for each day after expiration.
