The stage is all set to continue the argument—indefinitely.

The day after the President spoke, congress finally started work on the question that has overshadowed every other problem this session. The first move was the senate judiciary committee's. A Big Gun-Runner "SOS . . . Bombarded . ing . . . Sinking . . . SOS."

The call letters were those of an English passenger liner. The location was 90 miles off the Spanish coast, in the Bay of Bis-

For six tense hours, while British destroyers rushed to the scene, European chancelleries feared an "incident."

Then another wireless message crackled out: "I have been in communication with the Spanish cruiser Canarias, which states that the Spanish ship Mar Cantabrico was sunk." It was signed by the skipper of the British destroyer Echo.

Blockade runner for the Spanish government, the Mar Cantabrico, was an old hand at stirring an international rumpus. Early in January she lay at a New York dock loading American airplanes and other supplies for Spain's loyalists.

Suddenly aware that the U. S. neutrality law did not apply to civil wars, congress raced to plug the loophole. But the freighter got away first.




