

The top graph shows how each state fared in 1936 in the campaign to reduce auto deaths. The graph at lower left shows how pedestrians and autoists fared relatively in accilents, and the chart at lower right shows the relative rise in auto deaths in cities as compared to the rate in small towns and on the ountry roads. The complete casualty list of about 38,500 deaths in 1936 is an all-time record, an increase of about 4% from 27,000 victims of 1935.




