GOV. CROSS URGES ASSEMBLY TO ACT ON FLOOD CONTROL

In First Special Message of Session, Executive Asks for Quick Consideration of Pact With Sister States.

State Capitol, Hartford, March 23.—(AP)—Gov. Wilbur L. Cross transmitted to the General Assembly today the proposed four-state flood control compact together with a special message urging it be given "immediate consideration."

The chief executive's first special message of the session told the General Assembly that Connecticut would bear 40 per cent of the cost of acquiring dam sites and maintaining them.

He gave the total cost of acquiring the dam sites as \$2,000,000, of which Connecticut would pay \$1,000,000.

In addition, it would cost Connecticut \$50,000 a year interest and amortization charges on a bond issue recommended to raise the funds for purchasing the dam sites.

The governor said in his message: "Connecticut has a vested interest in the compact which she must acquire quickly or else funds from the federal government available for the four New England states will necessarily be transferred to other states."

AUTO STRIKERS QUIT PLANTS IN DETROIT BUT PLACE PICKETS

Over 6,000 Sit-ins March from Eight Chrysler Factories; Men in Other Plants Prepare to Evacuate; Conference at Lansing Resumed Again Today

Detroit, March 23.—More than 6,000 striking automobile workers marched in swirling snow today from eight Chrysler Corporation plants they have held since March 8, but prepared to establish picket lines until their strike to exclusive bargaining rights is settled.

The "sit-down" in the Chrysler Kerchvald plant, the last to hold out, ended today. The workers there agreed to give up their strike last night.

Word of the Kerchvald victory was spread to the Dodge plant and 5,000 strikers there marched on the plant.

TWENTY PERSONS KILLED IN MOTORBUS ACCIDENT

Washington, March 25.—(AP)—The oft-advanced theory that man has caused drought and climatic changes in this country is "utter nonsense," in the opinion of J. B. Kinser, climate expert of the Weather Bureau.

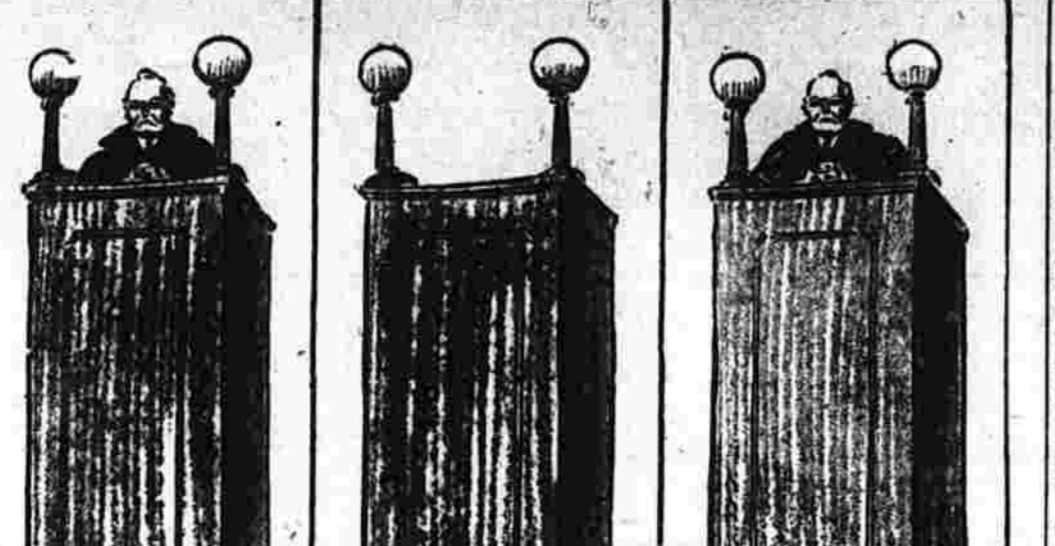

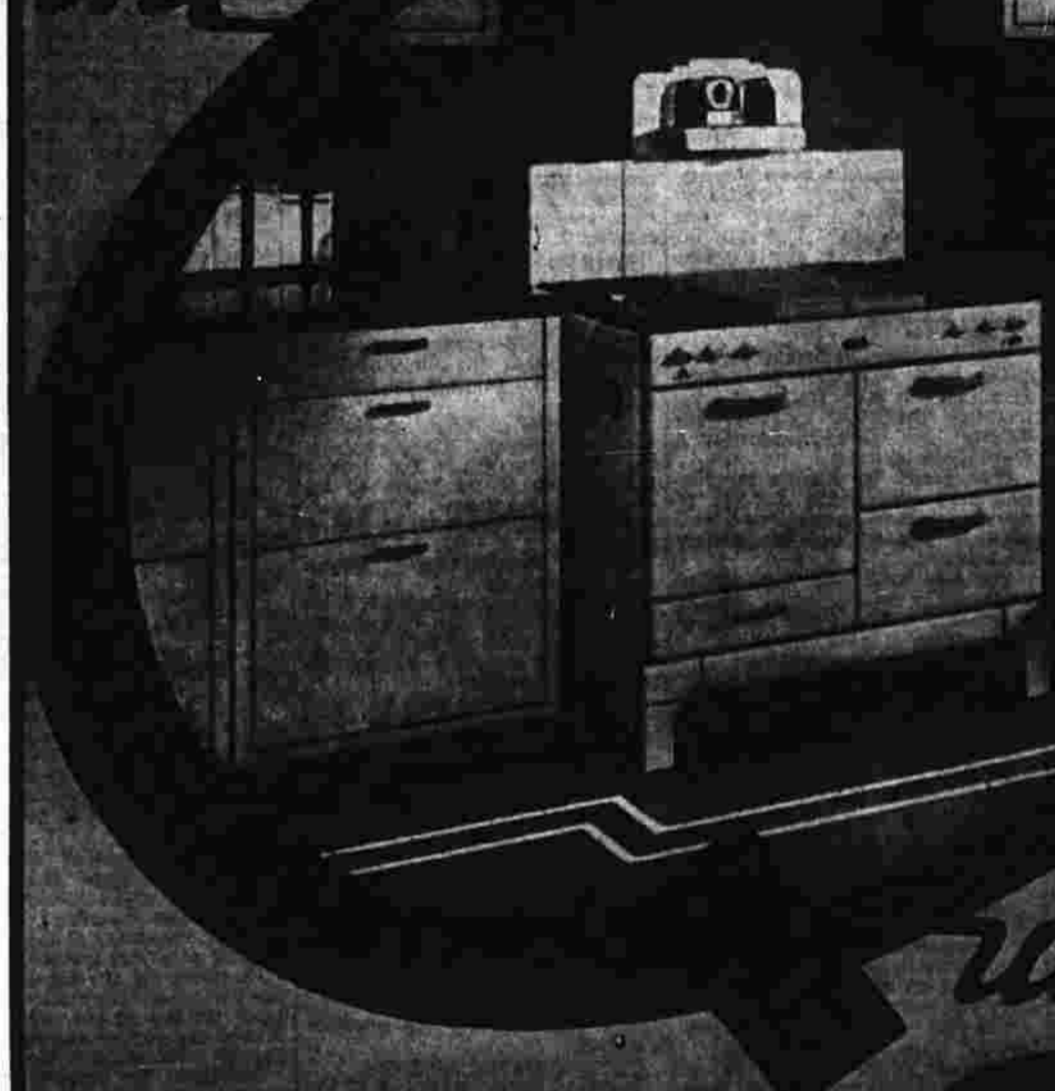
