He identifies the plant as the drosera, or sundew. It is very small, seldom having a leaf spread of more than two inches, and grows to a height of two or three inches. The leaves are covered with viscid feelers or stickers that hold small insects until they are devoured.

"Rare in any country," De Cross says, "carnivorous plants are virtually unknown in North America."
