NEW FORM OF TAX BILL THIS YEAR

Collector Nelson Asks That Taxpayers Keep Invoice Until Bill is Paid.

The bills which will be received by property owners next week consist of three parts, two of which will be detached when the tax is paid and retained by the collector's office and one of which will be the taxpayer's receipt.

The collector, August Nelson, Jr., today announced that property owners should keep the bills intact until they have paid the tax and that they should not tear up the bills until the collector's office has received the tax.

A slightly different form of bill and a different method of collecting the tax are expected, he said, to save time and space in the office.

The tax will be payable in two installments, due April 15 and July 15.
