Detroit, April 7— (AP) — Contests so close that the official canwas must decide some of them found six Democrata and three Republicans leading today with returns nearly complete from Monday's Michigan election.

With fewer than 90 of the state's 3480 precincts unreported, margins of 1,100 and 1,700 separated the apparent winners and losers of two contests, out of 786,000 votes tabulated. Only three apparent winners enjoyed leads in excess of 10,000.
Thomas F. McAllister, Democrat, and Justice Walter H. North, Republican, led for two places on the State Supreme Court. McAllister had a plurality of 4,500 but Justice North's lead over Chief Justice Louis H. Fead, Republican, was only 1,100. Walter I. McKenize, Democrat, was only 300 votes behind Justice Fead.

Edmund C. Shields, Democratic National committeeman, and John D. Lynch, also a Democrat, beind and Mrs. Lavins Masselink, Democrats, led for two memberships on the State Board of Agriculture with alender margins of 5,000 and 1,700.
Dr. Eugene B. Elliott, Republican, clung to a 5,000 majorit; for reelection as state superintendent of public instruction.
