PUBLIC WORKS BILL A Tall Thirst Is Quenched GETS APPROVAL OF ASSEMBLY GROUP

State Capitol, Hartford, April 9ee approved today a bill creating a thus opening the way for early consideration of the building program.

The committee voted to report the measure favorable during a brief session preceding the close of the fourteenth legislative week. Earlier in the week, Gov. Wilbur
L. Cross conferred with the chairman of the reorganization committee and was reported to have urged apeedy action on the public works bill. The chief executive, it was understood, favored creation of the department in order that there may be some state central agency to supervise and coordinate the building program.

The bill approved by the committee followed in the main the chief recommendations of the reorganization commission.

It provides for the appointment of a commissioner of public works by the governor with the advice and consent of the Senate. The commission, the administrative head of the proposed department, would receive \$9,000 a year and serve four years.

Commissioner's Work

"The commissioner of public works," the measure provides, "shall have charge and supervision of the planning, construction, erection remodeling, alteration, repair or enlargement of any real asset involving an expenditure in excess of \$1,000."

The governor would be required to name the commissioner before May

In addition to modifying certain sections of the commission's bill, the committee struck out provisions calling for the abolition of the Merital highway commission and the Hartford and East Hartford bridge commission, and the abandonment of the Rocky Hill and Chester-Hadlyme ferries.

The bill also eliminated commission on sculpture; make the state water commission a division of the public works department; abolish the commission a division of the public works department; abolish the commissioners of rivers, harbors and bridges; the state board of engineers, the New London ateamship terminal commission, the state dock at Guilford, the board of harbor commissioners of New Haven harbor, and the coast survey. All of these functions would have been delegated to the Public Works Department, under the commission proposal.

Mold Toxin Discovery May Eliminate Sprays

Ames, Iows, April 8.—(AP)—6 inum (spil organism causing barlown State college scientists announced today discovery of a cheap practic 1 method of controling mold—the leech-like growth that steals the lifeblood of plants and taints food.

Dr. I. E. Melhus and Dr. George C. Kent, botanists, said three years experimentation yielded a substance—a "toxin"—that will retard the fungus and mold growth on corn.

bariey, fruits and vegetables.

They estimated farmers may be able to save millions of dollars yearly by applying the toxin on fruits, grains and vegetables.

Losses due to fungus disease on all economic plants, they said, has been estimated as high as a billion and a helf dollars annually, compared with insect damage estimated to humans, plants or animals in the

science in the biological science in the biological science from and numbering possibly hundreds of species.

Science formerly assumed, they said, that mold, being of a higher order than bacteria, would not, as bacterial organisms frequently do, produce "self toxic" substances.

Their toxins are specifically harmful only to the organisms that produce them but a few of them, the botanists said, are harmful to similar species in the family from which the original mold came.

Specific molds and fungus toxins already developed by the two men, they said, were: Diological product.

Another possible use, but one which would require considerable additional research before it could be applied practically, might be in the preservation of foods, the botanists added.

Eventually, they said, the mold "inhibitor" being harmiese to man, might be placed in canned foods and on all fruits and vegetables.

They predicted it might be possible to control most of the mold growth that now "pesters the human race."

Mold Toxin Discovery May Eliminate Sprays

lowa State college scientists announced today discovery of a cheap, practical method of controling meid—the leech-like growth that steals the lifeblood of plants and taints food.

Dr. L. E. Melhus and Dr. George C. Kent, botanista, said three years' experimentation yielded a substance—a "toxin"—that will retard the fungus and mold growth on corn, barley, fruits and vegetables.

They estimated farmers may be able to save millions of dollars yearly by applying the toxin on fruits, grains and vegetables.

Science formerly assumed, they said, that mold, being of a higher order than bacteria, would not, as bacterial organisms frequently do, produce "self toxic" substances.

Their toxins are specifically harmful only to the organisms that produce them but a few of them, the botanists said, are harmful to similar species in the family from which the original mold came.

Specific molds and fungus toxins already developed by the two men, they said, were: Diplodea Zeae (dry rot of corn); Gibberella Suabinettii (barley scab); aspergillus Niger

Concentration necessary to retard mold growth.

Elimination of poisonous sprays, the scientists said, might be ingresserable use, but one which would require considerable additional research before it could be applied practically, might be in the preservation of foods, the botanists added.

Eventually, they said, the mold "inhibitor" being harmiess to man, might be placed in canned foods and on all fruits and vegetables.

They predicted it might be possible to control most of the mold growth that now "pesters the human race."


