Stillwater, Okla.—(AP) —Sows need plenty of protein in their feed to farrow healthy pigs, advises C. P. Thompson, swine specialist at Oklahoma A. and M. College.

Pigs born to sows with an ade-Pigs born to sows with an adequate protein supply during pregnancy will weigh more and be more vigorous than those from sows whose rations are deficient in protein. Thompson says. Proper balancing of rations is more important than feeding large amounts, he adds. He recommends pasture or a green-colored, leafy, leguminous hay as the best protein source for animais. He lists among good commercial protein feeds milk, meat meal, meat scraps and fish meal. Cottonseed meal, linseed oil meal and wheat shorts are economical sources.


