Washington, April 13.—(AP)—Here are answers to some questions of the Man-in-the-Street concerning the Wagner Labor Relations Act.

Q. What rights does the National Labor Relations Act guarantee workers?

A. It guarantees the right to organize unions and to bargain collectively with their employers through chosen representatives.

Q. How does the act work?

A. It provides a procedure for the selection of a union to represent the workers. If the union is chosen, it negotiates with the employer for a contract. If no contract is reached, the National Labor Relations Board may order a election to choose a union.

Q. What does the act do for employers?

A. It prohibits employers from interfering with the workers' right to organize. It also prohibits employers from discriminating against workers for union activities.

Q. How does the act affect unions?

A. It gives unions the right to represent workers and to bargain with employers. It also gives unions the right to sue employers for unfair labor practices.
