UNEARTH PLOT TO STAGE CORONATION DAY MUTINY

Managers of England's Largest Prison Had Planned to Make Dash for Freedom May 12; Officials Silent

London, April 15.—(AP)—The Exchange Telegraph Agency reported today officials of Dartmoor, England's largest prison, hoisted on the black outcasters moon, had uncovered a plot to stage a mutiny on Coronation Day.

Despite an official veil of secrecy, the agency reported it learned Dartmoor managers had been taken to suppress any outbreak at the lonely prison which houses inmates of convicted prisoners serving long terms.

The men were said to have been selected May 12, the day King George VI will be crowned, for a bold dash for freedom because they were angered by the fact no inmates will be granted or allowed to leave the prison.

This decision not to grant amnesty at the Coronation was announced in the House of Commons by Sir John Simon, home secretary, some time ago, but news of it was said to have just leaked into the prison.

Guards were said to have been warned by authorities not to discuss what had happened inside the prison. The reports of trouble were the first since the fire and mutiny of 1935, which resulted in a full official investigation of conditions at the prison.
