Army Up, Schools "Out, The amendment was passed by 24 to 9 roll call vote and will necessitate sending the measure back i

The debate, heard by a packed gallery, was marked by many bitter exchanges between Republicans and Democrats.

Party lines held intact during the roll call on the amendment.

Senators Gebhardt and Telesca, both Democrats, were absent. Before acting on the amendment, the Senate rejected a proposal that action on it be delayed to give Republicans time to study it.

Bradley's Request

Just before the roll call, Senators

J. Kenneth Bradley (R) asked Lieut. Gov. Frank Hayes to rule that any Senator who holds a state office and might be affected by the measure be ruled ineligible to vote.

The chair, however, ruled it was incompetent to say what Senators would be affected and that all members of the Senate would be permitted to vote on the issue.

The measure was the second major reorganization proposal to be approved by the Benate.




