

Braising, boiling, simmering and stewing are the cooking processes to use for less tender cuts of meat.

Although they are less expensive, these cuts are no less nutritious than more costly ones. than more costly ones. Try searing the meat first in a small amount
of fat. Such a process gives added
flavor and a good color. Vegetables and seasonings may be added
later. But the most important
thing is to remember that a little water and long, slow cooking are needed to break down the meat fibers and make them tender.

It is a good plan to save meat stock for invalid dishes. But in case you are out of stock and wish to prepare food for an invalid add to prepare food for an invalid add two quarts of water to one pound of chopped round beef. Then add one tenspoonful of salt and let the mest simmer in a covered pan for one hour. Remove any soum which rises to the top. Then strain the broth. The cooked meat should be served in combination with vegetables.
