TALK OF RELIEF CUT TO BILLION HEARD IN HOUSE

But Any Definite Decision Is Expected to Await the Return of the President

Washington, May 3.—The start of House hearings on a relief deficiency money bill brought today of cutting one-third from the \$1,000,000,000 recommended by President Roosevelt for 1938 relief spending.

Rep. Woodrum (D., Va.), acting chairman of the subcommittee holding the hearings, said he believed Congress' present economy mood might result in such a cut.

There was no prospect, however, of early action. Speaker Bankhead expressed the belief a final decision on the amount would be held in abeyance until the President returns from his fishing trip.

"I am sure the President will be glad to see Congressional leaders and workers in some method establish the amount of the relief bill," Bankhead said.

Relief spending has caused the bulk of the Federal deficit. This year's spending has been at a rate indicating the total will be nearly \$2,000,000,000.

Some critics of the size of Federal relief expenditures have contended that state and local governments were not bearing their share.

ENGLISH COURT GIVES FINAL DIVORCE ORDER FOR WALLIS SIMPSON

As Soon as Duke Hears the News He Rushes for Train Which Will Take Him to France to Meet Woman He Loves

London, May 3.—(AP)—The precise machinery of the British divorce court elected of Wallis Simpson (Simpson's final divorce decree today, and Edward Windsor, the man who deserted a throne for "the woman I love" lost not a minute in closing the gap between St. Wallis, Austria, and the French Riviera.

They are free to marry now whenever they choose—purchase in the chapel of the Chateau de Candia where Mrs. Simpson has been living—but probably not until after the pagentry of state that will put Edward's crown on the head of his brother, King George VI, nine days hence.

These swift divorces this morning and this noon brought ever closer the union of the lonely Duke and the Baltimore-born woman whose love changed an emperor's crown and thrilled the whole world.

Judge Sir Boyd Martin, a m.—Presiding over the divorce proceedings in the High Court today, pronounced the divorce absolute.

St. Wolfgang, Austria, noon.—Edward Windsor, drawing for a mountain hike, answered the telegram which announced through his secretary that Mrs. Simpson had obtained a divorce from her husband.

But the fact remained that Mrs. Simpson, who married Edward Windsor in 1923, was legally free to marry the former King at any moment.

WOMEN'S JURY BILL SIGNED BY CROSS

Pioneer in Women's Rights Field Among Those Present During the Signing

Hartford, May 8.—(AP)—Governor Cross dropped the curtain on women's long battle for equal legal and civil rights in Connecticut when he signed the women's jury service bill.

He not only practically eliminates the disparity between the two sexes in matters of legal rights and duties. This statement came today from a pioneer in the women's rights movement, Miss Katherine Loring, one of Old Lyme, president of the old Connecticut Women Suffrage Association and president of the Connecticut League of Women Voters.

Miss Loring was one of more than 25 women and one man who witnessed the signing of the bill in the governor's office. With her was a group of women who fought long and hard for their sex, some of them recorded in the history of the movement.

At least two of them were among the White House pickets who went to join in militant campaigns for women suffrage.

They were Mrs. Dorothy Bartlett, Democratic representative from Putnam; Miss Edna M. Purcell, of the state Labor Department; Miss Loring; and Miss Loring, who was the first woman to be elected to the division of the women's movement which opposed the peacetime and adhered to their belief that a less sensational aggressive campaign was wiser.

Women's legal and civil status is probably equal to men in this state, Miss Loring says.

However, she believes the nation at large "shocking disparity" between the sexes continues to exist.

Woman's job therefore, she insists, is to make the nation a more just and equitable one.
