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MORE 'STOP' SIGNS ORDERED BY POLICE Will Be Placed at Flower Street and North Elm Streets; Other Questions.

Manchester Green road, making the traffic going north or south on North Elm street to stop at the intersection as it has been found by a check that there is more traffic on the Manchester Green road than on North Elm street.
