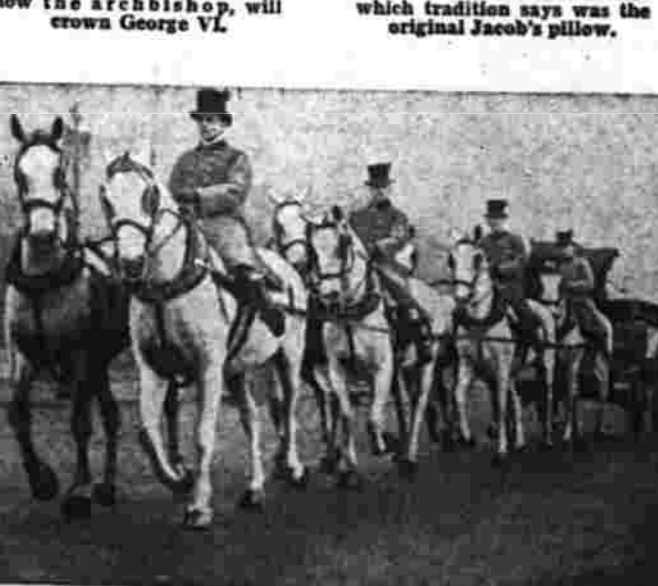

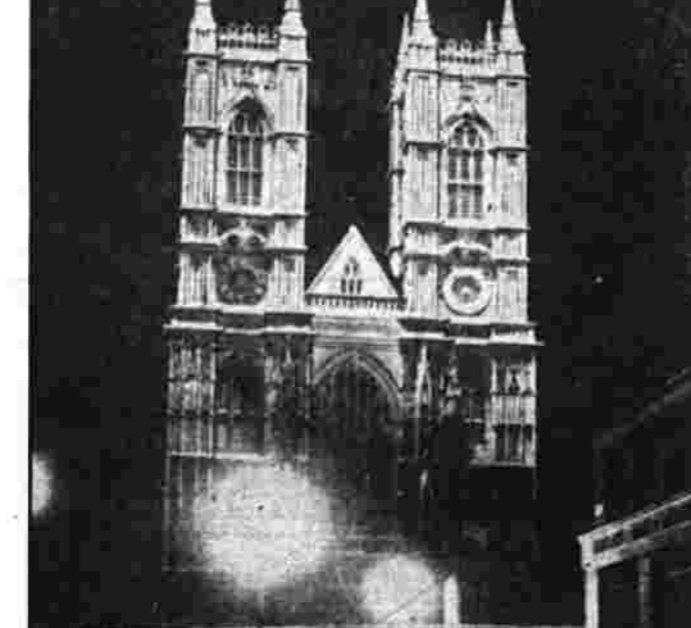

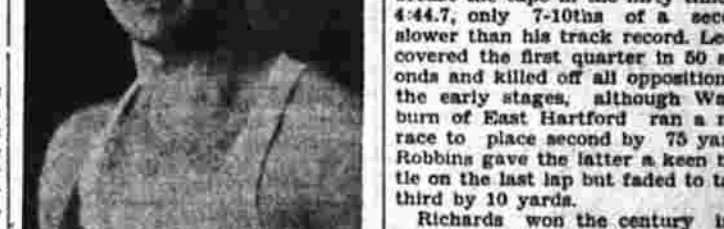

**SENATORS DEBATE COURT PROPOSALS**

Judiciary Group Begins Its Final Study of Roosevelt's Program; Radio Speeches.

Washington, May 12.—(AP)—The Senate Judiciary committee, beginning its final week of study of the Roosevelt court bill, took up today two alternative proposals for revising the Supreme bench.

Senator Burke (D-Neb.), a leading opponent, suggested a constitutional amendment limiting the court to nine members, providing for compulsory retirement at 70, and requiring seven votes to overrule acts of Congress.

Senator Meadows (D-Calif.), a supporter of the President's bill, submitted a proposal to increase the court to 10 and then let the states vote on a constitutional amendment to hold it at that size for 20 years. The committee will vote a week from today on whether to recommend the Roosevelt bill to the Senate. A majority of the 18 committee members oppose both the bill and any compromise.

The limitation of this vote has revived public criticism for and against the bill. Five Democratic Senators spoke last night against its adoption.

Senator Burke in a radio address said a constitutional amendment would end "the bitter struggle that otherwise will rage on indefinitely." The bill, he believed, has brought Congress to a virtual standstill and has retarded recovery because of uncertainty and fear.

Senators McClellan of Nevada, Gerry of Rhode Island, Copeland of New York and Bailey of North Carolina opposed the bill in addresses at a Philadelphia meeting of the Defenders of the Constitution.

Highlights from their speeches: Copeland: "The President does not allow suspension of dictation when he refers to a 'three-horse team' which he would make pull together, giving us to understand that he would crack the whip over all three branches of government."

Bailey: "The people do not think of the Supreme Court as a horse team; they know that it is a tribunal of

### The Family Doctor

WHAT IS IMPORTANT IN PROTECTING CHILDREN FROM RHEUMATIC FEVER.

By DR. MORRIS FISHERMAN, Editor, Journal of the American Medical Association, and of Hygiene, the Health Magazine.

In the prevention of rheumatic fever, attention must be given to improving the general health of children.

The child should lead a quiet, restful life. He must have plenty of rest and recreation.

Fatigue and exhaustion interfere with a child's digestion, and leave him prey to infection. For children who are exceedingly nervous and who tire easily, a rest period of a half hour before and after meals is recommended.

Damp, wet clothing always should be removed from a child when he comes indoors, and he should always wear enough clothing to insure warmth.

There should be plenty of fresh air in his sleeping quarters, but this air should not be damp or irritating. Children who suffer from sinusitis, ear or other disturbances of the nose and throat, sometimes are harmed by parents' over-enthusiasm in the matter of providing fresh air.

If a child has a diet with plenty of milk, butter, eggs, leafy green vegetables, fruits, and liver oil and other foods providing adequate amounts of protein, carbohydrates, fat, mineral salts and vitamins, his nutrition will be satisfactory.

If the youngster has a tendency to be persistently underweight, if he is constantly under the weather, if his digestion is constantly disturbed, if he is more likely to become a victim of heart disease than otherwise, if he is particularly prompt to catch cold and sore throat. Children who suffer constantly from sore throats or infections of the nose and sinuses should be carefully watched by a physician and, if possible, should be moved to a warm climate so they may have a better opportunity for complete recovery.

There is no certain cure for rheumatic fever; no drug or serum that can be depended upon to have specific effect. The child, as has been said, must be put to bed promptly if this condition is noted.

Mayor McLevy conferred by telephone yesterday with Morgan Moseley deputy labor commissioner.

Following the talk with the mayor said that "so far as I am concerned there is no strike. I won't meet with delegations from the former workers. They are all through."

The strikers who continued picketing are being made to have regional units of the National Labor Relations body step into the situation.

Mayor McLevy and Mr. Brewster expressed satisfaction with the work of the new crew yesterday.

Mr. Brewster said the picket lines were only slightly behind schedule. "Just as soon as the men become accustomed to the work a bit more" the director said "we expect the city's garbage and ash collections service to be normal."

### GORMAN APPEALS FOR FEDERAL AID

Says Textile Industry Will Collapse If Congress Does Not Regulate It.

Washington, May 12.—(AP)—Francis J. Gorman, president of the United Textile Workers, told a House Labor subcommittee today the textile industry is heading toward a "complete collapse" within three months "unless Congress acts to regulate it."

Testifying on the Ellenhogen bill to create a "Little NRA" for the industry, Gorman said economists and other "competent authorities" had predicted the "collapse."

The stocky union leader informed the committee a textile union "organization drive, backed by John L. Lewis' Committee for Industrial Organization, had a \$1,000,000 campaign fund."

"When we announced the drive," he said, "the first thing the employers did was to announce a wage increase—which was very welcome."

Then, he said, they extended the "speed-up" and began piling up inventories.

"They are producing at break-neck speed," he continued, "to penalize the workers and unless Congress regulates it we will have a complete collapse. There will be no production."

Gorman criticized what he termed the "big-in-the-middle" attitude of the employers toward the fight.

"If they can't write the provisions," Gorman said, "they don't want to play."

### SEES CRISIS NEAR IN WAR ON CRIME

Special Prosecutor of Rackets in New York City Explains the Work Ahead.

New York, May 12.—(AP)—New York City's racket-smashing special prosecutor, Thomas E. Dewey, in his first public discussion of crime since 1935, gave warning today of an approaching crisis in society's war on crime.

Addressing a meeting of the Citizens Committee on the Control of Crime in New York, Dewey told of his successful fight to destroy the restaurant racket which extorted millions of dollars from New York restaurateurs, and described the anti-crime methods the committee proposes to employ.

"I believe the struggle between organized society and organized crime is slowly reaching a crisis," he said.

The restaurant racket, Dewey recalled, had its beginning in 1922 when a few corrupt officers of two small unions entered into a shake-down agreement with the notorious Dutch Schultz and his henchman, Julius Martini.

Hundreds of concerns became its victims. Some paid "rackets" as high as \$50,000. Dewey recalled that individual appeals to the courts for relief proved ineffective. It was the special prosecutor said, that "the racket had been tried and found perfect."

When members of the unions complained of their corrupt leaders, Dewey said, the leaders "damned them as Communists and expelled them."

The restaurant racket, Dewey recalled, had its beginning in 1922 when a few corrupt officers of two small unions entered into a shake-down agreement with the notorious Dutch Schultz and his henchman, Julius Martini.

Hundreds of concerns became its victims. Some paid "rackets" as high as \$50,000. Dewey recalled that individual appeals to the courts for relief proved ineffective. It was the special prosecutor said, that "the racket had been tried and found perfect."

When members of the unions complained of their corrupt leaders, Dewey said, the leaders "damned them as Communists and expelled them."

"I believe the struggle between organized society and organized crime is slowly reaching a crisis," he said.

Tide of Battle Turned After Dewey was appointed special rackets prosecutor by Governor Lehman, however, the tide slowly turned. But the fight was bitter.

"It took four lawyers, three accountants and ten police detectives 18 months to procure the evidence in this case," he said.

When it finally came to trial there were 18 defendants, two lawyers, seven labor union officers of whom three were dead, and six gangsters, two of whom were dead and two were fugitives.

"One of the two remaining gangsters pleaded guilty and a jury after 10 weeks of trial, convicted the rest, who were broken to the end."

Dewey recalled that both Schultz and Martini were murdered during the time of the racket.

"His recorded voice and gambing as a tower of strength and steady income to the artistry of crime."

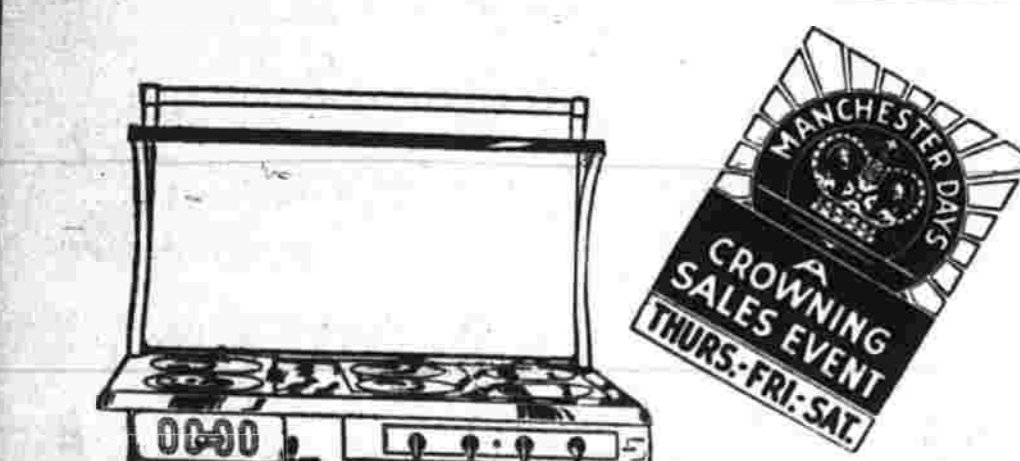
Reformation Agencies Then turning to a description of regular law enforcement agencies he said they included in New York City five district attorneys, 152 assistant, the state attorney general's rackets bureau, the United States attorney general's rackets bureau, two United States district attorneys, the Department of Justice, the Federal Alcohol Tax Unit, 12 other Federal bureaus, and 15,000 city policemen.

"Here," he said, "is a labyrinth of procedure and overlapping and conflicting jurisdictions which would almost seem to have been specially designed for the comfort of criminals."

His own force, Dewey said, is by comparison so small that his work must be regarded only as a laborious and unglorious task. It is to demonstrate that organized crime is not above the law.

The special prosecutor said the Citizens committee has an important part of assisting in the war on rackets and crime.

"Its function," he said, "is to provide the necessary leadership, public opinion, combined with a careful study of law enforcement as it actually operates."

### SETS TRUST FUND FOR HIS EMPLOYEES

Harmon Elliott Puts Aside \$250,000—Announces an Increase in Wages.

Cambridge, Mass., May 12.—(AP)—Three hundred and fifty employees of the Elliott Addressing Machine Company learned today they had been made beneficiaries of a \$250,000 trust fund established by President Harmon Elliott in an effort to restore the harmony between employer and employee that existed in many small factories when I started in business.

The fund, estimated to yield an annual income of \$17,200, would provide "by deeds instead of words," Elliott said, "a mighty answer to the politicians who are trying to stir up class hatred."

The income will go on December 1 every year to employees with more than 10 years' service, he explained. "When the trust fund ends, as trust funds do, the principal will be divided among a factory employes of more than three years' service."

At the same time Elliott announced a wage increase of five cents an hour for married men and three cents an hour for single men and women, the total to cost his firm approximately \$30,000 annually.

The fund that he has set up is a trust in 30 years," Elliott explained he had considered the trust "for ten years and had the plan drawn up April 1, 1936, anniversary of his entry into the business founded by his father in 1882.

When the trust ends, the fund will be divided according to employees' length of service but the trust income will be divided according to the pay scale. Only non-beneficiaries in the business are Elliott and his only son, Roy, a vice president.

Explaining his fund was intended as an "answer" to the politicians who are trying to stir up class hatred," Elliott declared, "It seems to me the politicians are stumpy putting their hands in my pocket and handing out my money, and thus with my money the politicians are getting my employees to feel gradually that their future depends more on politicians than on me."

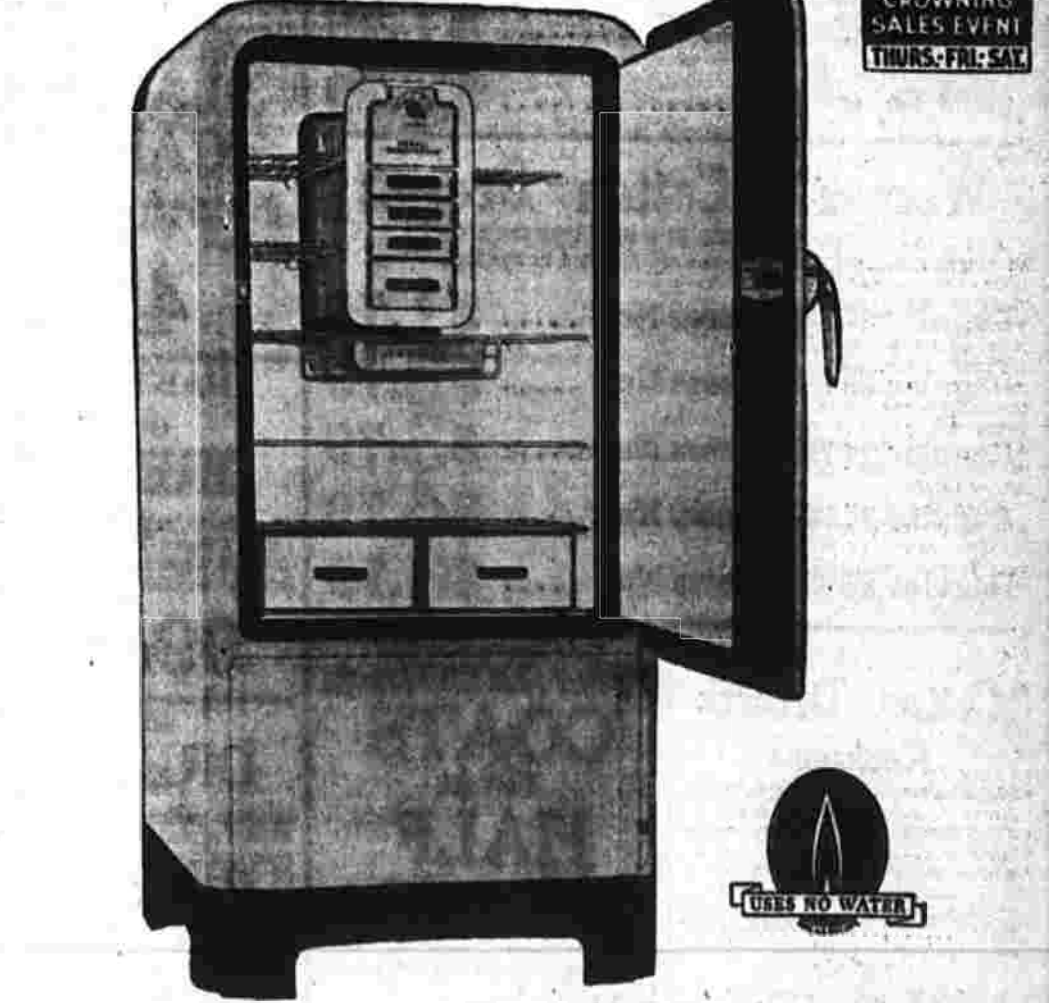

### ENGINEERS SHOWN TELEVISION TESTS

Newly Developed Tube Shows Images On a Screen 18 by 24 Inches Square.

New York, May 12.—(AP)—Television on a screen—images 18 by 24 inches square produced by a newly developed cathode ray tube—was demonstrated to the stiver anniversary convention of the Institute of Radio Engineers here today.

The picture has a brightness equal to that of home movie, by increasing the distance from the screen it is possible to obtain an image as large as three by four feet good enough to be viewed by an audience of several hundred.

Adjustment is obtained through a simple optical system placed before the fluorescent end of the tube, where the original picture appears at the small size of 1 1/2 by 2 1/2 inches.

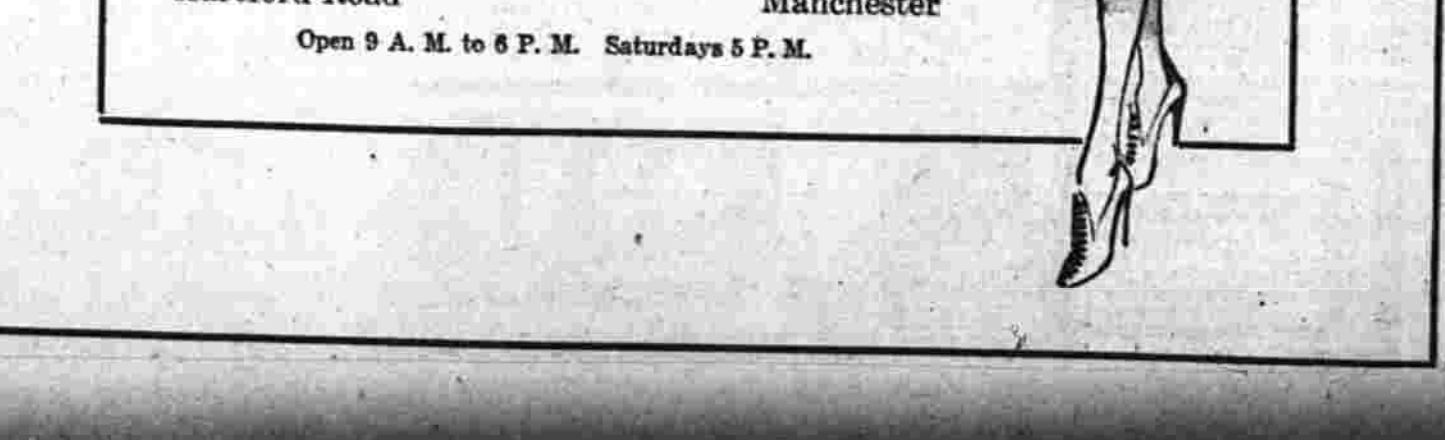
