TO RAISE STATUS OF NORMAL SCHOOLS

Appointee to a state post created by the reorganization program, "public works director" Robert A. Hurley, today announced that he had approved the bill to raise the status of normal schools to that of a regular state department.

Hurley's budget for 1937-38 and 1938-39 was approved by the House yesterday. He asked for expenditures of \$42,226 during 1937-38 and \$31,046 during 1938-39. About \$20,000 of the appropriation was for a new normal school building.
