



Preparing Seed for Putnam Farm at Warehouse Here; Is Speedy Operation.

Louis L. Grant, who was one of the first in this section to turn over his tobacco land to potato raising on a large scale, had made a further change in the use of his land and is now harvesting a crop of asparagus on acreage formerly used for growing potatoes. He is not to g.v. up growing potatoes, but instead has purchased a 150 acretract in Putnam where he already has started planting.

In his warehouse in Buckland a farce of workers is handling seed potatoes. There are six young women at work in the ware house cutting up the potatoes providing a certain number of "eyes" for each potato hill that is to be planted.

The method of operation is sim-The method of operation is simple, but fast. In front of each girl is a stationary knife blade. The girl picks up a potato from a bin in front of her and if it is a smail potato it is cut in half, but if it is larger the potato is cut in two more parts. These are dropped into a basket at the girl's feet and when there is a half a bushel so cut they are placed in sacks. It takes twenty sacks of these potatoes to plant an acre.






