STRIKE THREATENS HEINZ CO. PLANT

Pickets Swarm Around Big Pickle Factory; Demand Recognition of the Union.

Pittsburgh, May 25. (AP)—Hundreds of pickets milled about the gates of the vast north side plant of the H. J. Heinz company today, carrying a strike ordered in an effort to obtain recognition of the Canning and Pickle Workers Union.

Operations were virtually suspended with workers who wanted to go back to their jobs remained on one side of a street running through the factory grounds and the pickets patrolled the plant entrances on the other side.

The plant, employing approximately 2,500 workers, covers several blocks along the Allegheny river front. It is the headquarters of the Heinz empire.

Picketing continued peacefully through the early hours of the morning. Men and women were seen in the streets.

Frank Novak, president of the local union and a militant in the strike, said that the company did not believe the union representatives could get the company to recognize the union.

The strike vote was taken by Frank Krack, state representative of the West Virginia House of Delegates, who is president of the Workers Local, No. 434, at the plant.
