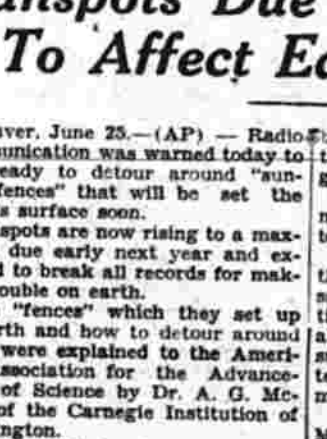

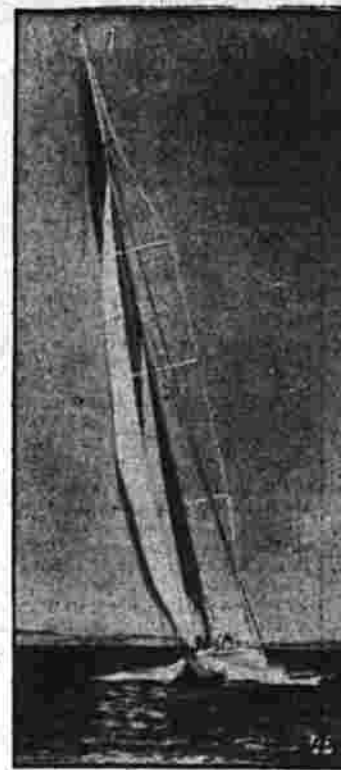

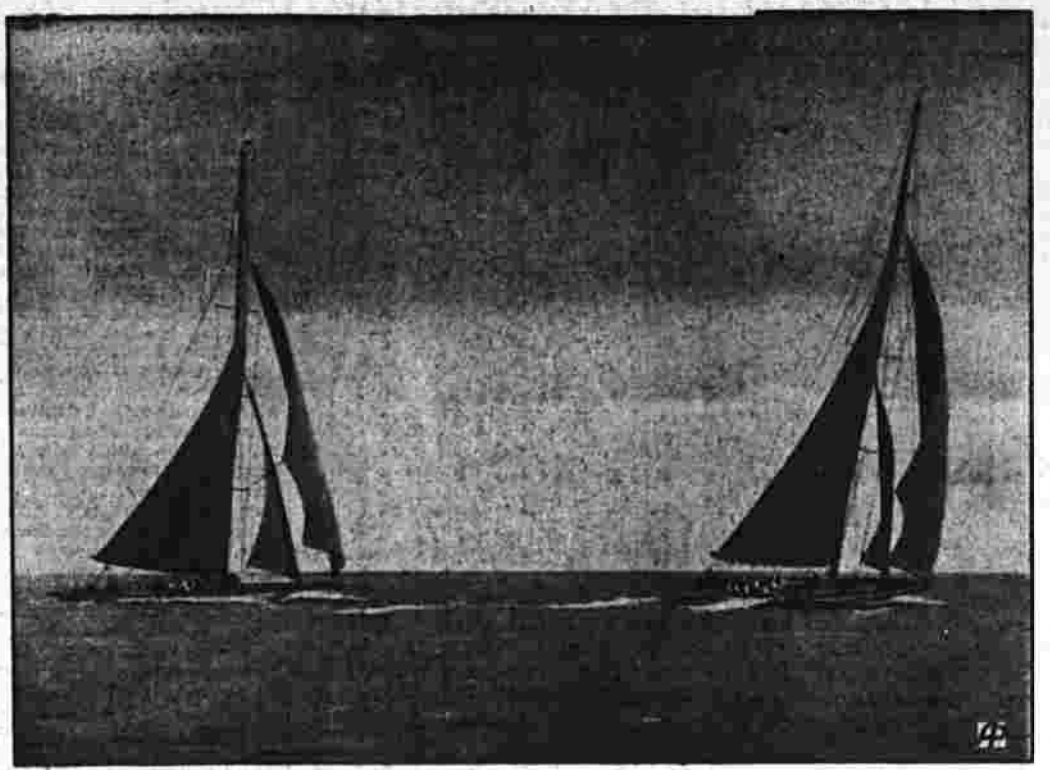

Few of the lanes are working at capacity. Out of 41,134 registered motor vehicles, the department had inspected 240,286 as of June 22. There will be no extension of the

closing dates—July 24. There will be a careful check-up on ALL cars which, according to records, were not inspected. Suitable disciplinary action will follow.
