New Haven, July 12—(AP)—Botanists at the Connecticut Agricultural Experiment Station attributed today to one of three possible causes the condition of wilting and browned maple trees which have attracted wide attention in the state during the past two weeks.

The condition may be due to sun scorch, anthrocose or a disease called maple wilt.

Maple wilt, most serious of the three, is capable of killing many kinds of trees and the only known remedy is surgical, Dr. Florence Mo. Cormick, a botanist at the experiment station, has found.

Sun scorch affects many maples during weather such as the current hot spell and, although there is no affected may be perfectly vigorous unother season.
