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### WAGE, HOUR BILL IS AGAIN HALTED

#### This Time President Asks That No Action Be Taken Until Tomorrow.

Washington, Aug. 7.—(AP)—The House Labor committee unexpectedly postponed consideration of the wage-hour legislation today. Chairman Hamilton (D-N.Y.) said action was delayed at the request of President Roosevelt.

Mrs. Norton told President additional amendments would be submitted to the committee. Another committee member, Representative Green, said the committee would be held in session until tomorrow.

The Labor committee chairman reiterated the hope her committee would complete consideration of the legislation in time to permit debate in the Senate before the adjournment. She asserted, however, she would rather not see any bill passed if it failed to meet the requirements of the act.

"This incident forcibly demonstrates the low estimate in which the act is held today," he added. "We are here only to lead the master's voice."
