THE BRITISH NOTE
 The British note of protest on the
 shooting of Ambassador Katochibumi
 Higashimura by Japanese aviators
 takes a higher plane than was
 to be expected. It demands
 a formal apology from Japan, the
 punishment of the persons responsible
 for the shooting, and a guarantee
 against any recurrence of similar
 incidents. It notably does not make
 any point whatever of the diplomat
 slain, but rather emphasizes the
 violation of international law and
 the attitude of the Japanese
 government.

JAPANESE VICTORY
 The New York Times on Saturday
 printed a special column on the
 cablegram from Hong Kong de-
 claring that the Japanese navy
 has won a decisive victory over
 the British fleet in the South China
 Sea. The cablegram states that
 the Japanese fleet, consisting of
 10 battleships, 10 cruisers, 10
 destroyers, and 10 submarines,
 defeated the British fleet, which
 consisted of 8 battleships, 8
 cruisers, 8 destroyers, and 8
 submarines.

FOR A NEW G. O. P.
 In 1936, long before the Republi-
 can national convention, Senator W.
 Borah attempted to lead a move-
 ment within the Republican party
 to drive out of its leadership the
 ultra-conservative who for so long
 had controlled the party, and to set
 up a liberalized party organization
 which, he believed, could go before
 the people of the country with an
 organization and a program that
 would restore the support of the
 majority of them, or at least put
 an impressive fight and restore
 something like an equal division of

strength between the two major po-
 litical parties.
 Neither because too many Republi-
 cans were dominated by a selfish
 and complex, or the time was too
 short, or the case of the Idaho sena-
 tor was not presented with sufficient
 vehemence by enough supporters,
 Borah didn't get very far with his
 party. His warning against per-
 mitting the Old Guard to run the
 party in that presidential year was
 disregarded—and the G. O. P. under
 the de-hatched ultra-conservative
 leaders and cursed by the approval
 of the American Liberty League,
 went straight ahead to the most
 devastating defeat ever experienced
 by any major party in the nation's
 history.

WIMMY ZIMMY
 Charles Wimmy, who swam the
 way from Albany to New York City,
 taking more than six days for the
 job and never once getting out of
 the water, has been named as
