



COUMDUS, O.—(AP)—On the average Ohio pasture, a cow would have to take 180 bites of grass a minute for 12 hours in order to keep its milk production up to scratch, says D. R. Dodd, agronomist at Ohio State University.

If a cow is to produce 25 to 35 pounds of milk, it must consume 200 pounds of milk, it must consume 200 pounds of grass to get the necessary amount of digestible proteins and nutrients, he figures.

The average pasture has only about 1,200 pounds of grass an acre available at one time, so the cow would have to harvest one-sixth of an acre daily. And that calls for 180 bites a minute for 12 hours.

Dodd suggests improving the pasture.






