After the War for Independence had been won, Americans soon became dissatisfied with the Articles of Confederation they had set up to govern themselves. It was a very loose union, almost like a tiny "league of nations" joining the 13 independent colonies into a league, but with no power to levy taxes, regulate commerce, or even to coin money. By 1787 it had become clear that things could not go on with so leose and wobbly a central government. State legislatures chose delegates to a national convention which was to "amend" the Articles of Confederation. Even from nearby New York, it took three days to get to Philadelphia over frightful roads. To many the journey was an expensive and trying ordeal of several weeks.

George Washington, leader in winning the free-dom of the colonies from England, was also the leading spirit of the convention. 


