 "How the Constitutional Convention Was Gunned"

After the War for Independence had been won, Americans soon became dissatisfied with the Articles of Confederation they had set up to govern themselves. It was a very loose union, almost Daniel Shayne had Massachusetts farmers in the short-lived rebellion against depression helped, the federal government was almost helpless, and people were deeply disturbed by the outlook.

By 1787 it had become clear that things could not go on with so loose and wobbly a central government. Many legislatures chose delegates to a national convention which was to "amend" the Articles of Confederation. Even from near-by New York, it took three days to get to Philadelphia over frightful roads. To many the journey was an expensive trying ordeal of several weeks.

George Washington, leader in winning the freedom of the colonies from England, was also the leading spirit of the convention. His rock-like firmness was about all that had been holding together the loose fragments of a country-to-be. He was chosen to preside over the convention, which included many men of notable reputation and ability.
