Hartford, Sept. 15.—(AP)—The State Forestry Department was faced today with the need for reorganization of its entire fire fighting system owing to the new merit system banning of anyone active in politics.

Because these men are normally employed by State Forestry, Lathrop said they are called on to serve as fire wardens and to attend to forest fires.

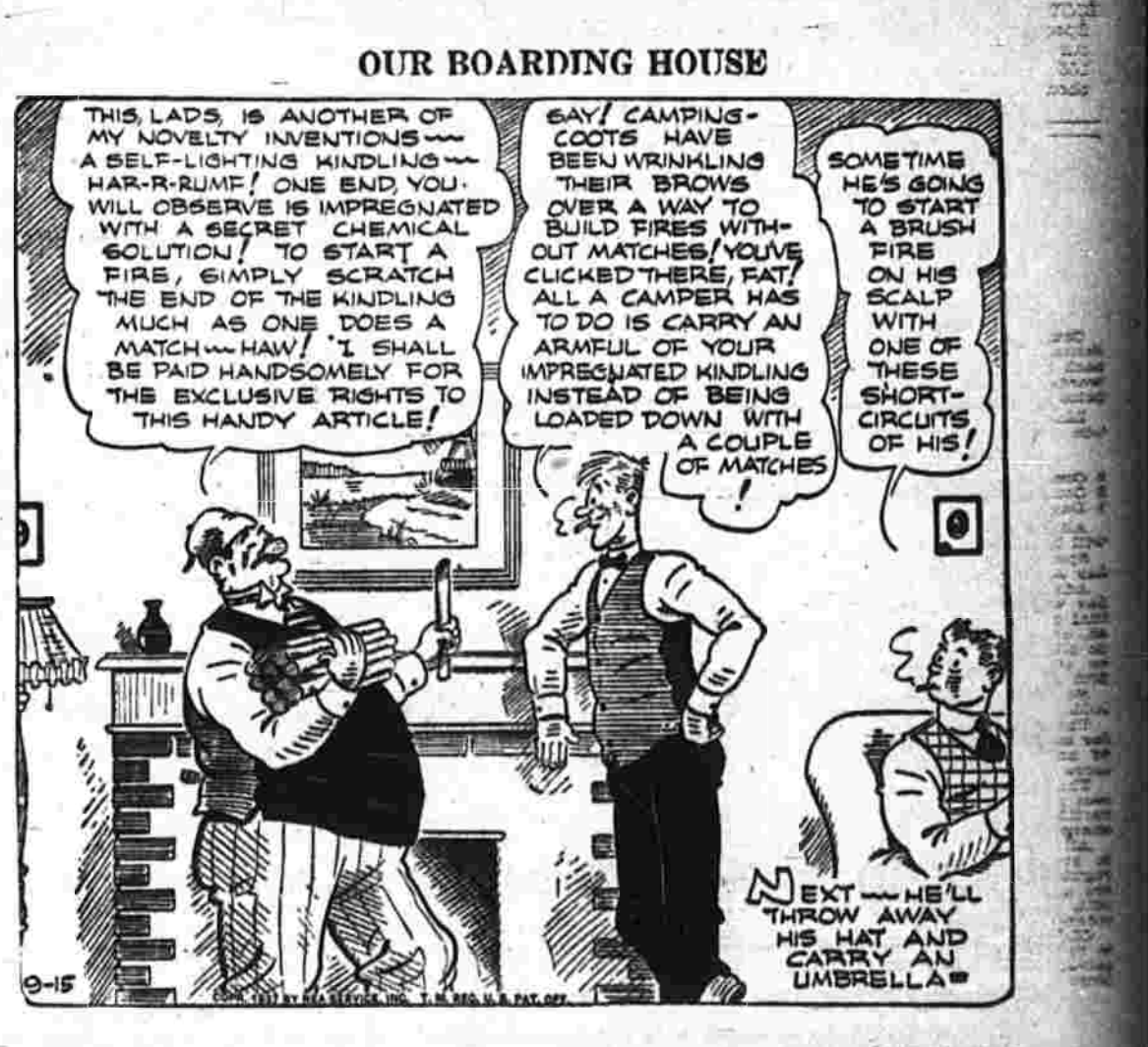
