WORD CHARGE

WORD CHARGE ON STATE ROADS of those sections of highway which have proved to be most dangerous for night-time driving is being demonstrated by statistical data on accidents, accumulated from several sources including those which show the upward trend of auto fatalities on illuminated highways. That the lighting of all highways would involve excessive costs at the present time is admitted by highway, motor vehicle and illuminating the lighting of selected, dangerous stretches thousands of lives could

be saved each year.
Connecticut studies have shown Connecticut studies have shown that the trend of night fatalities has been upward since 1926, while day auto deaths show the opposite trend, and that 60 percent of the fatalities and nearly 50 percent of the accidents take place at night despite less heavy traffic. National Safety Council statistics reveal exactly the same thing, namely, that

actly the same thing, namely, that six out of every ten persons killed last year on the highways met death after dark. Night fatalities, however, will not stay in that ratio. They have been increasing and if the present rate of increase continues night auto deaths, experts say, will grow to 26,000 in 1940 as compared with 22,000 last year and that by 1940, 70 percent of all accidents will occur at night unless Other statistics show that anyone involved in an automobile wreck at night is 92 percent more likely to be killed than in the daylight, and

FIGURES REVEAL

this is because of the lack of visi-bility at night, despite the fact that headlights for automobiles have reached about their highest state of practical efficiency. To make them any brighter would augment one of the basic causes of night ac-cidents, blinding glare. The present headlight enables the driver to see an object about 150 feet ahead. A car going 50 miles per hour moves 73 feet each second. When a dark object looms up 150 feet ahead, the driver therefore has just two sec-onds to see it, to comprehend the danger, judge the size and direction of the object and to bring the car to a halt. Full lighting from overhead this is because of the lack of vis a halt. Full lighting from overhead would reveal the object much earlie would reveal the object much earlier and permit time for stopping.

Effectiveness of highway lighting is shown in a report on the installa-tion of improved illumination on 31 miles of street in Detroit. Before the lighting went into service in 1934 and 1935 there were 146 night and 21 day fatalities on these streets, a ratio of seven to one. Since the new lighting has been in operation (four to eight months on different sections), there have been but five night and four day fatallities, almost an even ratio. Had the new lighting been installed in 1934 and 1935, there could have been a saving of more than 100
