



I never have considered and I do not now consider the unsolicited card given to me shortly after my nomination to the Senate as a memberahip of any kind in the Ku Klux Klan. I never used it. I did not even keep it.

I believe that my record as a Senator refutes every implication of racial or religious intolerance.

I have no sympathy with any organization or group which, any-where or at any time, arrogates to interfere in the slightest degree with complete religious freedom.

Any program, even if directed by good intention, which tends to breed or revive religious discord or antagonism, can and may spread with such rapidity as to imperfi this vital constitutional protection of one of the most sacred or human rights.




