Chicago, Oct. 13.—(AP)—An overtones of optimism pervaded reports of a majority of states on current relief problems, but the actual improvement expected this winter varied widely.

FEARS DICTATOR RULE IN NATION

Bankers Told People Do Not Realize What Is Going On at Present.

Boston, Oct. 13.—(AP)—Heming W. Prentiss, Jr., Lancaster, Pa., manufacturer, today told American bankers a "right dictatorship" faces the nation unless the "road ahead" is reorganized and reformed.

"As General Hugh S. Johnson said the other day," Prentiss told the annual convention of the American Bankers Association, "we are moving toward a right dictatorship because we don't realize what we are doing to ourselves. Certainly there are enough straight-thinking Americans who will insist that this dangerous road ahead be reorganized and reformed."

In the first convention talk in which President Roosevelt and the New Deal were mentioned specifically, Prentiss, head of a cork company, expressed "concern" over Mr. Roosevelt's court policy; over Federal aid and how it is being used; and over the Federal Reserve.

Prentiss, who declared he was a "democratic litigator," said he was in sympathy with the majority, but he was not in sympathy with the "New Deal." He expressed "bitter fears," however, over the "road ahead" and the speed with which it is being taken. He said he was "convinced" that the "road ahead" is leading to a "right dictatorship" unless it is reorganized and reformed.

Two Day Session in New Haven Tomorrow and Friday With Twelve Denominations

The Connecticut Council of Churches and Religious Education and twelve Protestant denominations have united their forces in a week-making demonstration of the unity which binds them together. The convention which will meet in Woodbury Hall and nearby churches in New Haven, October 14 and 15. The theme is "A United Christian Advance."

The opening session will be held at 10:30 a. m. tomorrow, at Woodbury hall, the auditorium of Yale University. The Rev. Merrill F. Clarke, president of the Council of Churches and Religious Education, will preside. The devotional service, led by the Rev. Floyd W. Tomkins, will be the same as was used at the World Conference on Faith and Order held at Edinburgh in 1937.

Speakers. The Rev. Adolf Keller of Geneva, Switzerland, will address the gathering on the subject "Christianity's Mission to the World."
