"I guess he's given them a pretty complete story of the gang's movements since they broke out of jail a year ago," Foley said of the all-night quinzing in Dalhover's cell.

The wounded mobeman claimed, Foley said, that the gang did not intend to "do anything" in Maine, but merely wanted to replenish an arsenal depleted badly when the trio barely escaped G-Men at Baltimore.
