HOPKINS DEMANDS CENSUS OF NEEDY

Tells His State Directors He Must Have The Figures Before November 20.

Washington, Oct. 22.—(AP)—Henry L. Hopkins, director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, today told his state directors that he must have a complete census of the needy in the United States by November 20.

"I want to get a WPA figure on the number of people in need," Hopkins said. "The crisis of the whole country is not how many people there are—that's the crisis of unemployment."

The Hopkins survey evidently is an attempt to get a more accurate picture of the unemployed in the United States. The census is to be undertaken by November 10. Hopkins also instructed his state directors to get the names of all the unemployed in the country.
