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## Mr. and Mrs. Average Briton Skeptical of Windsors' Tour

In democratic, plain-thinking Lancashire—way from London and the political and social clamor—Milton Brommer, famed foreign correspondent, finds here average Englishmen now fed about their ex-king, the Duke of Windsor, and his recent re-entry into the public limelight.

Liverpool, Oct. 30.—The plain, middle-aged folk in Lancashire, watching the recent trip of the Duke of Windsor in Germany, and contemplating his forthcoming American tour, are wondering just how much of it is due to a genuine desire to investigate housing and living conditions of workers, how much due to a yearning to enjoy the high life in the good old days when he was Prince of Wales and later King.

So far as the genuine, solid, down-to-earth investigation of working class conditions in Germany is concerned, the Windsor excursion was a farce. Windsor, on his tour of Germany, was to the left of him, Black Nat Guards around him, and plain clothes men in back of him. Plain clothes men with working people as a snowball has down around the Equator. Dr. Ley, the bull-necked, bull-voiced Nazi boss of labor saw to that. Let us go to Windsor like his shadow. Or

Lancashire folk always took their Prince of Wales and their King Edward VIII at their own valuation and not that of the London papers and social circles. And the verdict seems to have been an unfavorable one. As a Lancashire business man told me: "Oh, he's just as well as we are rid of him and get his steady, job-seeking brother on the throne."

Memories of Prince Anything

But the fact that the longest memories are the Lancashire newspaper writers and photographers. They can't see him as the one-time "Prince Charming" for a little while. Forgetting their own and you get things like this:

As Prince of Wales, he was invited to a big day at a huge industrial model plant near Liverpool. The firm has a world-wide reputation and has branches and plants almost everywhere in the habitable globe. After the then Prince of Wales and his entourage arrived, the manager of the plant and been given a splendid lunch. It was planned he should come down to the factory and see the heads of the firm and heads of departments. The manager of the plant was being verbally examined:

Examiner—"If you were by yourself in a police car, and were pursued by a desperate gang of criminals in another car doing forty miles an hour on a lonely road, what would you do?"

Candidate (promptly)—"Fifty."

On another occasion there was a big jamboe of the Boy Scouts. Newspaper photographers had been sent to the jamboe managers that at a certain hour the Prince would sit for them. He did not show up. So they were told to come the next morning at 8 o'clock to the tent of the Prince. They came—but he had gone off to play golf and remained there all morning.

It was like this—true or colored makes no difference—which causes Lancashire to cross its fingers on the Duke. Also, it may explain why, last Christmas season when children went about singing Christmas carols, the thing that won them generous gifts of coins in Liverpool was "Hark the herald angels sing—'King, Simpson's placed our

course, part of this was courtesy on the part of the Nazi government. But also a considerable part was cool calculation. The Duke was taken on a rapid inspection of all kinds of things—labor camps, modern factories, recreation centers, housing settlements. But it was the kind of inspection a sovereign jumps one of the hop, skip and jump variety—and then lunch. It was not the kind of inspection a real investigator makes, notebook in hand, jotting down facts, figures, impressions and the gist of talks he has had with masters and men. If Windsor had a notebook, he did not pull it out.

In other ways the German trip was a success. It undoubtedly did annoy some of the higher-ups in England. The Duke and his Duchess once more became first page news in the London and the provincial papers. Squabblers of
