SEES TARIFF WAR AMONG STATES

State Commissioner Hackett Strikes Back At Michigan For Its Action On Taxes.

State Commissioner Hackett today struck back at the state of Michigan when charges, has been discriminating against Connecticut wines sold in its western state.

Michigan, Commissioner Hackett said today, has been imposing a tax on Connecticut wines larger than the tax paid on Michigan wines.

The Connecticut commissioner thereupon invited a section of the 27 assembly members of Michigan to meet in his office in Detroit to discuss their violation in cases of this kind to be made by imposing extra taxes on products sold here from the discriminating state.

Connecticut Commissioner Hackett has notified all Connecticut distributors and will advise the fact in newspapers in Lansing and Detroit that he has issued 20 additional reciprocal tax bills to be imposed as follows:

1. An additional reciprocal tax of five cents per gallon on all wine sold in Michigan.

2. An additional reciprocal tax of five cents per gallon on all wine imported into Michigan from any foreign state.

Michigan's act in taxing Connecticut wines is being interpreted here as the beginning of a tariff war between the two states.

Commissioner Hackett said that he has taken no action to discriminate against Connecticut, but the Legislature there attempted to do so by imposing a discriminatory tax.

Commissioner Hackett reports that his office is now studying the situation in other states to see how Connecticut stands in the rest of the country.

The Connecticut law imposed today by Commissioner Hackett on Michigan wines is in addition to the regular taxes.

Each of these additional reciprocal taxes is to remain in force as long as Michigan shall discriminate against wines manufactured in other states or fruits grown in the state of Michigan.

Michigan's new law provides for a tax of 35 cents per gallon on all wine imported from any foreign state and 25 cents on wine under 21 per cent alcoholic content.
