30 XMAS CLUBS SAVE 7 MILLIONS

Survey of State Shows Record Set for Number of Members, Money Paid Out

New Haven, Dec. 15.—(AP)—Conceded residents and merchants will have the merriest and most beautiful Yuletide season in many years if Christmas club disbursements are any indication.

A survey by the Associated Press of payments to members of Christmas clubs by banks of 30 cities and towns in the state indicated that the year 1937 set a record both for the number of club depositors and the amount paid out.

In these 30 communities the banks have recently paid \$7,844,968 to 155,877 Christmas club members. Figures furnished by banks maintaining Christmas clubs in 29 of the communities showed that almost every club member was a member of the club members this year and a marked increase over last year.

The only place in which this was not true was Naugatuck where members numbered approximately 140 less than in 1936.

Bridgewater, which showed large gains in this year, again led the clubs in the number of members and in the amount saved, although it is not the third largest in Connecticut.

In the City of 23,700 persons received a total of \$1,758,739 in Christmas club deposits. A year ago 28,000 Bridgewater residents received \$1,291,000.

Hartford was ranked second in the state in the amount of deposits, \$1,100,000, although New Haven had the second largest number of depositors, 30,000. There were 7,297 Hartford members, more than in New Haven received approximately one million dollars.

Average Savings. The figures showed that average club member banked \$417 in the club during the year.

The Norfolk depositors, on an average, were the thriftest, saving \$27.10 per person. Members in Greenwich were second, saving \$24.32 each on an average, while the Bridgeport member received \$23.78.

The average Middletown member was at the foot of the list, saving only \$27.41 during the year. The figures for 1937:
