In these 30 communities the banks have recently paid \$7.844,968 to 185,987 Christmas club members. Figures furnished by banks maintaining Christmas clubs in 29 of the communities showed in almost every instance there were more club members this year and a marked increase over last year in the amount of money diabursed among the depositors.

The only place in which this was not true was Naugatuck where members numbered approximately 140 less than in 1936.

Bridgeport Leads.

Bridgeport, which showed large gains in this year, again led the state in the number of members and in the amount saved, although it is but the third largest city in Connecticut.




