UNDULENT FEVER GERM SURVIVES WHEN FROZE

Tests Show It Is Unhurt I Frozen Milk Or Ice Cream Pasteurization The Answer.

Freezing does not kill the germ of undulant fever in milk, the State Department of Health advised in its weekly bulletin today, citing one case caused by ice cream made from milk produced by the family cow and urging that only milk from cows free from infection or milk that has been pasteurized be used These are the two ways of preventing undulant fever.

These are the two ways of preventing undulant fever.

When cases of this disease are investigated by health authorities to ascertain the source of infection, it is usually found that the patient has been drinking raw milk from infected cows, the bulletin stated. This does not mean that the cown have undulant fever. Instead they have a bovine disease known as infectious abortion or Bang's Disease, the germs of which produce undulant fever in man.

Moreover, when the source of a case of undulant fever is found to be raw milk from a dairy herd, testing procedures normally reveal a considerable portion of the head be raw milk from a dairy herd. testing procedures normally reveal a considerable portion of the herd to be infected. A few years ago, two cases of the disease were traced to milk from a herd consisting of only two cows. In another, a family cow gave more milk than the family needed and part of the milk was sold to a neighbor. A member of the neighbor's family came down with undulant fever. In still another instance, out of a family of six using milk from one cow two were infected although one case was so mild it would not have been recognized had not the other case

enough to last for months or eye years.

In investigating a recent case, very careful questioning brought information with reference to only one possible source of infection, ice cream made from milk from the family cow. The patient had not drunk any of the milk, but had estimate the cream made from the milk. en ice cream made from the milk.

Bang's Disease is widespread among the cattle of this state, the builtein said, and, since the disease may be transmitted to humans from a single cow as well as from a dairy herd, it is a wise precaution for people with family cows to have them tested for Bang's Disease to make certain that they are not being exposed to the danger of infection with undulant fever. This is one way to prevent infection and the other is pasteurization.






