Boston, Dec. 23.—(AP)—Army planes and police boats searched Boston harbor today for the body of U. S. Army Corporal Harold J. Kramer, 35, of Winthrop, whose parachute descent as a flying Santa Claus turned to tragedy last night over Boston's oceanside airport when a freshening wind blew him into the water.

Veteran of more than 100 successful jumps within eight years, Kramer plunged to his death white his young wife and their eighteen-month-old son looked on in the midst of a group of Army wives and children to whose Christma. party he was making his annual contribution.

The new clubhouse recently purchased by the Manchester Green Athletic Club will be dedicated Tuesday evening of next week when the members will gather for a Christmas party.


