Washington, Dec. 29.—(AP)—s "It does this during the months Deputy Commissioner of Fisheries Charles E. Jackson sank a verbal harpoon today into that derisive figure of speech—"the poor fish."

"It's all wrong," he said. "The fish is not a boob. He's amart, and the phrase ought to be reeled in from the vocabulary of every carefully speaking American."

He cited some examples:

"We have cases of the Columbia river salmon swimming down to Monterey and then returning not only to the river of birth, but wiggling into the very hatchery door.

"The silvery smelt reads the calendar better than most humans. Three days after the full moon at an hour after high tide, it swims ashore and lays its eggs on the sand.


