"The time has come," the Council declared, "to get tough."

With few exceptions, police heads concurred. Some of the dissenters didn't like the word "tough" and preferred "firm" or "strict" but all expressed intentions to use extra vigilance to cut the appailing toil of dead and maimed.

Would Keep Drunks Out
Preventive measures were being adopted in an increasing number of cities and states. Police in Milwaukee, Peoria, Ill., Newark, Cleveland, among other cities, concentrated on keeping the drunk from getting behind the wheel.

Superintendent C. C. Taliman of the West Virginia State Police instructed troopers to patrol roadhouses and night clubs "to see to it that no one drinking takes hold of the steering wheel."

Police Chief John A. Murphy of Paterson, N. J., told motorists: "Park your car and take a taxi home; drinking and driving do not mix."

Cleveland's chief, George J. Matowitz, suggested New Year's everevelers either go home in cabs or hire unemployed to drive their cars.
