# Rumania Alarms The Jews And French

Trouble, Trouble . . . The world has about 16,000,000 Jews. Of these more than 900,000 live in Rumania, a fertile country about as big as New England plus New York and New Jersey. Last week an anti-semitic leader, Octavian Goga, became Rumania's premier. This week several Jewish newspapers were reported suspend-id, and the government forbade any Christian woman under 40 to work n a Jewish household. So Jewish anxieties about central Europe increased. Already a Jewish Telegraphic Agency survey shows: In Germany: The Jewish popula-tion has dropped from 500,000 to 382,-000 since 1933.

In Austria: A strong pro-nazi party unofficially from government jobs. In Hungary: Anti-semitic propa-In Poland: Here the Jews' plight is considered "the worst in the world."
Boycotting of Jews is encouraged officially and there is often violence.

The Palestine Problem The Palestine Problem

This situation, of course, increases the importance of Palestine, where Jews have migrated to establish a homeland Governed by Great Britain under a League of Nations mandate, Palestine now has 400,000 Jews and 875,000 Moslems. Inability of Jews and Arabs to get along peacefully there led to a proposal, last summer, to divide up Palestine.
